

MINUTES – QUARTERLY MEETING

Brazoria County Sheriff's Office

Deputy Charles Allen VanMeter

June 26, 2011

Deputy VanMeter was killed in an automobile accident when a vehicle failed to yield to the oncoming patrol car. Deputy VanMeter, the passenger in the patrol car, sustained fatal injuries and died at the scene.

Beaumont Police Department

Police Officer Bryan Mitchell Hebert

July 8, 2011

Officer Hebert was killed when his patrol car was intentionally struck by another vehicle during a pursuit. Officer Hebert had stopped his patrol car and was removing stop sticks from his trunk when the suspect veered from the travel lane and struck his patrol car head-on. The collision knocked the patrol car into Officer Hebert. Officer Hebert succumbed to his injuries after being transported to the hospital. The driver of the vehicle is facing capital murder charges.

Bexar County Constable Pct 3

Sgt. Mark Scianna

August 27, 2011

Sgt. Scianna was killed in an automobile accident after activating his emergency equipment. His vehicle left the roadway, striking a utility pole and ejecting Sgt. Scianna from the patrol car.
