



The Collin County Sheriff's Office Civil Service Commission
Announces the Deputy Sheriff Civil Service Exam
Scheduled for Saturday, August 16, 2014.



Collin County is seeking candidates for the position of Deputy Sheriff. Individuals in the position of Deputy Sheriff enforce federal, state and local laws by serving legal documents, patrolling assigned areas, apprehending suspects and make arrests, responding to service calls, and making traffic stops. They perform investigations and searches, write reports, and provide court testimony. Deputy Sheriffs transport inmates to prison facilities, administer educational programs in various community-oriented programs, and coordinate emergency mental health commitments. They may perform other related duties as required. Functions may vary by individual assignment.

Only candidates who are available for shift work, including overnight shifts, are eligible to apply for this position - candidates MUST be available to work any shift. Candidates must have one of the following combinations of education and experience: Bachelor's degree, no experience required OR 60 College hours with at least one of the following; (1) three years of honorable military service or (2) two years of law enforcement outside a detention environment or (3) four years of detention experience

If a candidate without a license is hired, they will attend the first available academy to earn their license. The required license must be earned within one year of employment. Must possess and maintain a valid Texas Operator's Driver's License with an acceptable driving record.

Candidates for a Deputy position who have completed the online application and meet the qualifications will be eligible to take the written test established for the position. Based on the highest scores received on the test, up to thirty of the top candidates will be processed for an eligibility listing. The written exam will be scheduled and administered by the Collin County Sheriff's Office Civil Service Commission. Candidates will be notified by e-mail, following submission of the online application, on whether they qualify for the written exam, and if so, the time and location of the exam.
