The Brown County Sheriff's Office has a patrol deputy position available. We are looking for an experienced officer to complement our staff, however we are willing to train the right academy graduate.

Brown County has a population of approximately 38,000 people and is located in central Texas. The Brown County Sheriff is comprised of 33 full-time deputies including the Sheriff. Our patrol officers are responsible for criminal patrol, initial investigations, traffic enforcement, and community outreach.

Our officers are expected to be pro-active with enforcement and be involved within the community by participating in the community policing concept and our community outreach programs. The Brown County Sheriff's Office also takes great pride in having strong support from our community members.

The Brown County Sheriff's Office offers the following pay and benefits for the patrol officer position:

- \$42,261.00 as of 10/01/2021.
- Certificate pay up to \$600 per month after 1 year probationary period.
- Full medical Blue Cross Blue Shield provided to the employee at no cost. **Entire family medical Blue Cross Blue Shield is \$200.00 per month.**
- Retirement benefits are through TMRS, 2 to 1 match by the county.
- Employees accrue sick and vacation leave.
- If you live within the County, you are eligible for a take home vehicle.
- For the current budget year, the county offers 13 paid holidays.
- Hours over 84 in the pay period are paid time and a half overtime.
- Uniforms, duty gear, and body armor are issued by the department.

Job Requirements/Minimum Qualifications:

- Must be TCOLE certified
- Must be a United States Citizen
- Must have a High School Diploma or G.E.D.
- Must not have been convicted of any class A or B misdemeanor offense within the last 10 years.
- Must not have been convicted of any grade felony offense.
- Must not have been convicted of any offense involving family violence.
- Must not have had a driver license suspension within the last 5 years.
- Must be able to pass the TCOLE required medical physical, psychological and drug screen.
- Preference will be given to applicants with peace officer experience.
- Must be able to participate in and successfully complete an FTO program.

- Must have and maintain a valid Texas driver license, or be able to obtain a Texas driver license.
- Must currently be licensed by TCOLE and be in good standing.
- Must be free of mental/physical defect(s) that would prevent a person from performing the duties of a police officer.
- Must pass an extensive background check, psychological, medical physical, and drug screening.
- Must be willing to do shift work, patrol works 12-hour shifts, 84 hour pay periods

The Brown County Sheriff's Office has several Jailer positions available.

- 12-hour shifts, every other Friday, Saturday, Sunday off.
- Certificate pay up to \$600 per month
