

Quarterly Meeting Minutes

December 7, 2017

On Thursday, December 7, 2017 at 9:30 a.m., the quarterly meeting of the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE) was held at the J.J. Pickle Research Campus, The Commons Learning Center, 10100 Burnet Road, Bldg. 137, Austin, Texas.

Agenda item #1, Call to order

The Presiding Officer called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. Members of the Bryan Police Department Color Guard posted the colors. Commissioner Lemaux led the pledges of allegiance and Commissioner Hester gave the invocation. Presiding Officer Richardson recognized the Color Guard members, Lt. Dean Swartzlander, Sgt. Ryan Bona, Officer Darrell Fikes, Officer Alex Tran, and Officer Amanda Vela, and thanked them for their participation. Roll was called and there was a quorum present with only Commissioner Thomas absent from the meeting.

Agenda item #3, Approval of the minutes of the September 7, 2017, quarterly commission meeting at Austin, Texas.

Commissioner Oakley made a motion to approve the minutes. Commissioner Hollingsworth seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda item #4, Receive reports. Take action if necessary.

Executive Director's Report: Mr. Vickers addressed several items: The misconduct report that is sent to the commissioners quarterly is being revamped. Three training contracts have been approved since the September meeting: Williamson County

Sheriff's Office, Texas DPS Officer's Association, and Savant Learning Systems (Virtual Academy). There was discussion about the recent training coordinator's conference that was held in Corpus Christi. Staff changes were announced and new employees were introduced.

Credentialing and Field Services Director: Mr. Merchant reviewed the numbers for non-compliance and there are slightly over 1300 for a 35% decrease in non-compliant licensees from the previous cycle.

Enforcement & Special Services Director: Mr. Antu noted that new processes are expediting the work of the agency. Several independent school districts are opting for police departments rather than having school marshals. Commissioner Hester asked that an on-going goal should be to improve the case load for the agency's investigators.

Government Relations Director: Ms. Grigsby said that curriculum committees continue to prepare courses as required by the recent legislative session. Three additional courses have been posted on the Commission's website.

Commissioner Hester made a motion to accept all reports. Commissioner Oakley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda item #5, Receive reports, items to discuss, follow-up items from previous meeting. Take action, if necessary.

- Out of state/federal equivalency for county jailer training and telecommunicator training

Executive Director Vickers asked the commissioners to consider accepting the equivalency of a basic jailer and basic telecommunicator training from other states and the federal level just as we now accept those training courses for peace officers for licensing purposes. Staff recommends this be accepted.

Commissioner Hester moved to approve the training. Commissioner Hollingsworth seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda item #6, Take action to enroll and induct officers in the Texas Peace Officers' Memorial Monument. Waive the requirement for induction at a separate Commission meeting, and take action to induct officers into the Texas Peace Officers' Memorial Monument who were enrolled today.

Director Grigsby read the names of those that are eligible for inscription on the Peace Officers' Memorial Monument.

Commissioner Oakley made a motion to waive requirement to induct at a separate meeting and enroll at this meeting. Commissioner Hollingsworth seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda item #7, Discuss and take action on final orders of amendments to existing and new TCOLE rules.

- Final Amendment 1
§215.21 Credit for High School Public Services Endorsement-with changes

Mr. Beauchamp stated this rule is in response to HB 1545 (85R). The final rule has a non-substantive change so that there is a correct reference to Security Career Cluster under 19 TAC Chapter 130, Subchapter L

Commissioner Hester made a motion to adopt rule §215.21. Commissioner Oakley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Hester noted that there are some rules that mirror statute. Commissioner Hollingsworth said that the stakeholders are often directed to the rules more than the code so more clarification in rule under some circumstances is helpful.

Agenda item #8, Discuss and take action on proposed orders of amendments to existing TCOLE rules.

- Proposed Amendment 1
§211.1 Definitions
Mr. Beauchamp noted that this rule is being amended to reflect statutory changes pursuant to SB 386 (84R) and HB 867 (85R) broadening the definition of school marshal.
- Proposed Amendment 2
§215.9 Training Coordinator
This amendment ties the employment of the training coordinator to the training provider.
- Proposed Amendment 3
§217.1 Minimum Standards for Enrollment and Initial Licensure
This rule is being amended to clarify the temporary licensing of a jailer and a telecommunicator.

- Proposed Amendment 4
§217.7 Reporting Appointment and Separation of a Licensee
This proposed amendment consolidates all appointment requirements into one rule.
- Proposed Amendment 5
§217.27 Appointment Eligibility of a Telecommunicator
This rule is being repealed and replaced with new rule §217.7 which combines reporting appointment requirements for all licensees into one rule.
- Proposed Amendment 6
§218.3 Legislatively Required Continuing Education for Licensees
This proposed amendment is intended to clarify that the 40 hours of continuing education training includes the legal update changes.
- Proposed Amendment 7
§227.1 Appointing Entity Responsibilities
This proposed amendment refers to school marshals and makes a broader definition to encompass additional entities that may have school marshals. This is pursuant to SB 386 (84R) and HB 867 (85R). Rules §227.3 and §227.5 are being amended for the same reason.

§227.3 School Marshal Licensing and Reporting Requirements

§227.5 School Marshal Training Entities

- Proposed Amendment 8
§229.1 Eligibility for Memorial Monument
This rule is being repealed and a new rule is being proposed that condenses the eligibility for memorial monument requirements into one rule.

§229.3 Specific Eligibility of Memorial Monument
This rule is repealed and a new rule named Nomination and Selection is created. This new rule condenses the nomination and selection requirements into one rule which follows the requirements of HB 3647 (85R) and replaces §229.5.

§229.5 Determination Standards
This rule is being replaced by §229.3 to be in compliance with HB 3647 (85R).

As proposed, rule §229.1(b)(4) Eligibility for Memorial Monument read “the Employees Retirement System of Texas makes payments and provides benefits to the eligible survivors of the person as provided by Chapter 615, Government Code.” Mr. Vickers clarified that the Employees Retirement System of Texas is not the only authority that makes payments to survivors, but by legislative authority, they authorize the payment of benefits. Mr. Beauchamp suggested changing the proposed language to “the Employees Retirement System of Texas authorizes benefits to the eligible survivors of the person as provided by Chapter 615, Government Code.” This is the language that was voted on by the Commissioners.

Commissioner Oakley made a motion to accept all the rule changes. Commissioner Lemaux seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda item #9, Discussion of and take actions on proceedings for revocation, suspension, and other disciplinary actions.
